Recap: Speaker Kathryn Brewer MFT


We were so lucky to have Kathryn Brewer MFT speak to an intimate group of moms at Jessielyn's house. After enjoying some snacks, we all settled in to a comfortable place to explore the depths of sleep patterns and how we can better prepare our and our kids minds and bodies for rest. Kathryn presented for about 90 minutes not only in-depth insight into how a child's mind works but how they are immediately receptive to the harmonizing and balancing techniques she demonstrated for us.

We talked about evolutionary child exploration and how to nurture the gifts your child has already and how you can approach and guide them. The ability to see natural gifts can be difficult. It has really improved my parenting with him. She spoke about overload cues and how to pick up on the subtle cues a child gives that a parent may easily overlook. How to react and guide them into mindfulness, something we all need to be practicing in these hectic times.

We explored together how to align our meridian chakras and she showed us effective ways to wake up and then in return to calm down. She was a delightful teacher and took time with each of us to ensure we were comfortable and that we could not only retain the energy medicine but that we knew how vital it can be to our bodies. Kathryn has a very rich past and was able to briefly share with us the work she has done in Rwanda and in other places around the world.

How to Stop Facebook from Hijacking Your Attention

The most precious thing we can give to anyone or anything, particularly to our children, is our attention.

And the biggest Silicon Valley companies are all racing to dominate our precious attention. Facebook. Google. Apple.

But these platforms may have gotten too good for our own good. Recently, a number of technology insiders have sounded the alarm on the digital economy's pervasive attempts to get us and our kids to continuously click, comment, scroll, like, and share.

Sean Parker, the notorious Napster creator and the founding president of Facebook, has accused the world's biggest social network of deliberately "exploiting a vulnerability in human psychology."

In a candid interview with <u>Axios</u>, Parker said **Facebook was built** on one goal: "How do we consume as much of your time and conscious attention as possible?"

"It literally changes your relationship with society, with each other," he said of Facebook. "It probably interferes with productivity in weird ways. God only knows what it's doing to our children's brains."

In a recent essay, Nir Eyal, the author of <u>Hooked: How to Build Habit-Forming Products</u>, also warns us about the motivations of tech companies.

"Let's admit it, we in the consumer web industry are in the manipulation business," he <u>writes</u>. "We build products meant to persuade people to do what we want them to do. We call these people 'users' and even if we don't say it aloud, we secretly wish every one of them would become fiendishly addicted."

In a <u>blog post</u>, Facebook itself has started to acknowledge that social media can be harmful to your mental health. Passively scanning Facebook for even 10 minutes can put you in a bad mood, and liking or clicking on too many posts can hurt your sense of well being.

In her article for *The Atlantic*, <u>Have Smartphones Destroyed a Generation?</u>, Jean M. Twenge, professor of psychology at San Diego State University explains how abrupt shifts in teen behaviors and emotional states, including depression and anxiety, are being correlated with increased smartphone and social media use.

So what's the solution? Look in the mirror

It's up to the users—you, me, your kids, everyone—to make sure we're aware of how addictive technology can get, and to act accordingly. Sure we can blame Facebook, Google, Apple, and Netflix for us becoming addicted to their products. But as I tell my kids: maybe it's their fault, but it's your responsibility.

Here are some ways you can prevent Facebook and Instagram from taking away too much of your attention:

- 1. Remove Facebook and Instagram apps from your family's phones. You can always use FB and IG on your computer, but without the apps, you won't be tempted to constantly whip out your phone and get distracted.
- 2. **Disable notifications for FB and IG.** If you simply cannot live without the apps on your phone, at least disable the notifications. Here's how to do it on iOS and Android.
- 3. **Go on a Facebook/Instagram diet**. Set an example by spending at least a day (or try a week if you're brave enough) without checking your feed, and you see how you feel. You might actually like having some social media silence.
- 4. Speaking of silence, **don't contribute to the noise.** Really consider what you're posting every day. Does the world need another photo of latte art, as cool as it might seem to you in the moment? Another bathroom selfie? Really?
- 5. **Don't contribute to fake reality.** It seems that there are no unhappy people on social media. Everyone has it all figured out. The reality is that we can and should use social media to share our authentic feelings, not just the polished pictures we want everyone to see. It's not a competition to see whose lives are more perfect! Be honest. Be genuine.
- 6. **Stop taking your phone to the restroom.** I'm not sure if there's been any research done on this, but I would bet that the average time people spend in the restroom had tripled in the past few years. I don't think our digestive systems have changed that much to justify the extra lost time.
- 7. **Social media is like email: There's always more to read.** Just like with email, we've learned to better manage our time and only check email during specific times of the day, or at least, that's what we should be doing. Take the same time management approach to your social media.
- 8. Here's a really novel idea: **How about making a resolution to spend more time with your family and friends in real life?** Like, face to face. If social media is making you unhappy or anti-social, getting out and meeting people you enjoy and care about should be the antidote to those depressive feelings.

In the Attention Economy, time is the most precious commodity. Just as you're careful about how you spend your money, learn to spend your time more wisely. Facebook is great for connecting with friends and family, but no single platform should deserve so much of your attention.

The Annual NMC Rummage Sale was held at the Downtown Novato Recreation Center on Saturday, March 10th.

Friday night set up and seller drop / QA went seamlessly! What a difference a small change in procedure makes! For the first time this year, sellers were asked to neatly place their items for sale out on their respective tables. This made it so our volunteers were able to concentrate on setting up the tables, organizing and getting the sale ready for the next day! Our volunteers did an amazing job helping get everything ready for the sale and we were set up in record time! Everyone had a great time setting up, snacking on pizza and just enjoying each other's company. What a fun night prepping!

On Saturday, the doors opened at 8am for our volunteers to shop early and then again at 9am to the general public. It was a perfect day for a sale! The weather cooperated so our generous sponsors were able to line the walkway leading into the sale. We had near 500 shoppers that came to our sale and purchased 3500+ items! There were still plenty of great things left over for our Outreach shoppers.

Every year we invite families in need from our community to shop for free at the end of the sale. This year we partnered with North Marin Community Services, The Gilead House, Homeward Bound of Marin, Marin Pregnancy Clinic, North Bay Children's Center and Concerned Parents of Novato and were able to serve 18 families! Everything that was left over after our Outreach shoppers were donated to Loved Twice and Goodwill!



One of the goals of last years' sale was to improve the experience for outreach shoppers by recruiting bilingual volunteers to greet and assist Spanish speakers. It was so successful and created such a better experience for our shoppers that we offered this again this year and again, it was really helpful for our Outreach shoppers.

The event had gross sales of \$8,699.51 with \$4,230.10 going to the club. Of the money that went to NMC, \$837.00 was raised through items donated to the club and \$53.00 was raised by selling Tuttimelon cards!

Total raised from sponsors was \$4,100! Thank you to all of our amazing sponsors!!!

Our bake sale was also a HUGE success! We had 15 talented members who baked, along with donations from Rustic Bakery, Teeny Cake, Noah's Bagels and Piece of Cake Confections.

The sale of all of these amazing baked goods along with coffee donated by Starbucks, brought in \$671.41 directly to the club.
